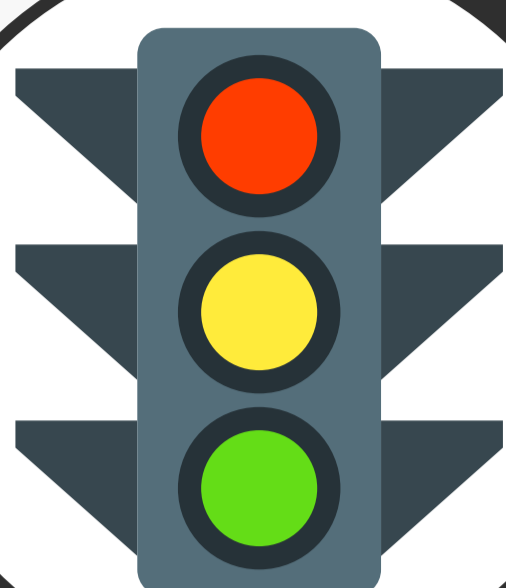


TOP 6 REASONS

Car Accidents Happen



Rolling Right Turn

6 percent of all pedestrian fatalities are caused by the rolling right turn at a red light, in which a driver doesn't come to a complete stop.



Asleep at the Wheel

Studies show that it is reasonable to estimate that about 7 percent of all car crashes occur because someone fell asleep while they were driving.



No Control

A driver losing control can be blamed for about 11 percent of all accidents. Whether a driver is behaving aggressively or driving in a manner that isn't safe for road conditions, losing control is a very real possibility.



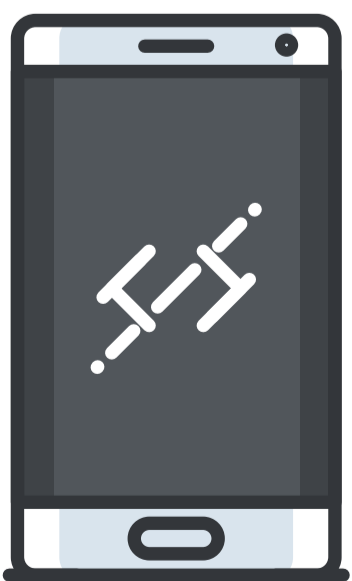
Driving Blind

What happens when you are driving next to a semi? Maybe you are driving down an unfamiliar road in the dark, and you are unaware that a stop sign lies ahead. These are instances of driving blind.



Following Too Closely

Rear-end collisions account for between 23 and 30 percent of all collisions. Even if you are leaving enough space between you and the vehicle in front of you, they may suddenly slam on their brakes.



Leaving the Lane

33 percent of all accidents are caused by someone leaving their lane of travel. When your attention is taken away from the road ahead, you may drift out of your lane or off the road altogether.
